FPC – Session Meeting Highlights – March 21, 2023

- Sue Russell led the opening devotion and prayer.
- The Session re-elected Liz Burns as Clerk and Jan Falkowski as Treasurer.
- Liz Burns gave the Clerk's Report. She put together a Session Duty Roster for the upcoming year. Average attendance at Worship has been 73. There were several funerals in the past month, including for Annette Ray, Joann Tamin, Jane Reilly, Dot Martin and Amelia Andruski. New Elders and Deacons were welcomed. The Session approved a building use request from North Fork Reform Synagogue for a Holocaust Remembrance service on April 16. A baptism request was approved for the son of Tara Campbell Bolletieri, sister of Ashley Campbell Loreto, also on April 16.
- Jan Falkowski presented the Treasurer's Report for February 2023. Her detailed reports, including balance sheet, revenues and expenses, are very helpful to the Session in understanding the finances of the Church. She prepared an updated counting schedule, so that each week's collection is counted by one Elder and one Deacon, per the recommendation of our auditor.
- The next meeting of the Presbytery of Long Island will be April 22 in West Islip, and an Elder is needed to attend.
- Peter Kelley continued his leadership development on Emotional Processes and Family Systems Theory with a discussion about Functioning Position within groups and families.
- Mike Mraz reported for the Deacons. This month, they put together three baskets for the Sober House. They made a donation to East End Hospice in Annette Ray's memory. There was one Person In Need (PIN) request this month. The Casserole Club is serving five people on Thursdays. The Deacons provided several funeral receptions this month. And they made a donation to help with earthquake relief in Turkey.

David Kilbride will become the new Committee Chair. The Committee is helping to sponsor a talk called "Slavery on the North Fork" at FPC on April 11 at 7 pm.

 Friends for preschoolers attracts roughly five children each week. S.A.L.T. for
 elementary schoolers has 40-47 attendees each week volunteers are very much
 needed! There may be a Summer S.A.L.T. program. Kids' Church is growing, and
 participating in the beginning of worship each week. Youth Group is meeting on

- John Touhey reported as the new Chair of the Personnel Committee. The Committee has made an offer to Daniel Koontz to serve as organist and Music Director. It is a part-time position, beginning in April.
- Ralph Edwards joined the Session in order to serve as Chair of the Finance &
 Stewardship Committee. The Committee is looking for new insurance that can improve
 our coverage and save money. They will be reaching out to people to clarify their
