

Providing short-term housing for families in need

A MISSION OF SOUTHOLD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

WHAT: A transitional housing program designed to help a local family who is experiencing a housing crisis. By offering a place to live for up to one year, we hope to give our residents the chance to find a more permanent foothold on the North Fork.

WHERE: We have refurbished our 1836 Manse on the Main Road, the former home of generations of Presbyterian pastors. The Manse has been used to house overnight guests from Maureen's Haven, and housed a family in crisis for six months in 2022.

HOW: In partnership with CAST, we seek to help people who are struggling with the high cost of living on the North Fork. We're also providing rental assistance to a family who fled the war in Ukraine and is living in Orient.

WHY: We will use our Manse to meet an urgent need and to serve our neighbors in a tangible way. By housing a family in crisis and connecting them with resources and support, we hope to make a difference in our corner of the world.
